- II. Verses 4-8 Idols: A stark contrast to the living God
  A. Idols and those that make them share the same folly
  - i. They have mouths but do not speak
  - ii. Eyes, but do not see
  - iii. Ears, but do not hear
  - iv. Ultimately, they put their trust in counterfeit gods because they do no know the true God
- III. Verses 9-18 Know God and ask for His blessing
  - A. Pray for knowledge and trust in the Lord
  - B. Ask for God's blessing
    - i. God has promised to bless His children
    - ii. Use God's blessing to show that our God is the God of the living!

Conclusion: We are not the main benefactor of God's blessing. Remember that God's blessings are to be used for God's glory.
